"Thank you for your interest in becoming a trustee for Papertrail. I am delighted to be the current Chair and look forward to being joined by new board members in the next phase of the company's storytelling journey.

I discovered Papertrail ten years ago after seeing its launch show, Day to Go, and was struck by the beauty and value of the work and its relevance to communities in Wales. Since then, Papertrail has created an incredible track record of producing high quality theatre, capturing and telling untold important stories that need to be heard. Stories of refugees facing unimaginable experiences, stories from working class communities in Barry that were relayed to audiences as they travelled aboard a local bus, stories of former prisoners shared with audiences over a meal at The Clink Restaurant in Cardiff, Stories of the nuclear links between Wales and Japan during the second world war and, more recently, we were proud to present A Visit, our latest production, produced in association with Clean Break. This gripping drama highlights the impact the prison system has on families, especially single mums serving time from Wales. The success of this performance last year has opened opportunities for it to tour in 2025.

We have several exciting new projects in development including, Moses, Grobbelaar and Me which is written by our founding director, Bridget Keehan and Co-Director Jonny Cotsen.

As the company develops, we are developing our board too. As we begin this new phase of Papertrail we would like to hear from potential trustees from a diverse range of backgrounds who share our values and ambition, who can work alongside the core team, the board and help us shape the future of Papertrail."

Our aim is to dig out untold stories and present them to audiences in engaging ways. Each production blends distinctive writing with adventurous staging, and involves working alongside communities in the creation of the work. Our process is driven by curiosity. We want to get to know the people in a particular place and find the story that needs to be listened to.

Papertrail has been producing shows for over 10 years and is about to embark on a new chapter.



Thanks to support from Arts Council Wales, Founder and Director Bridget Keehan and new Co-Director, Jonny Cotsen have created a new strategic vision for Papertrail to continue to capture and share untold stories, especially from those who are unrepresented in theatre including the Deaf community. Over the next few years, Papertrail plans to develop the company by recruiting a team to support its ambitious plans, including, a General Manager and Creative Producer. It will develop an Associate Artist & Mentoring scheme and a pilot a BSL interpreter/theatre director training programme.

VISION

Papertrail is a theatre company that aims to engage with the broadest range of individuals and communities across Wales and to create opportunities to tell stories through live performance. Through collaborative partnerships we strive to break down barriers to creative participation, challenge societal norms, entertain and inspire.

Creatively ambitious: We aim to bring distinctive productions to people in different places, to embrace innovation in the way that we work, and to tell stories in exciting and unexpected ways.

Our work engages with a wide and diverse range of people and we want our Board to reflect this. It is our aim to enable more people from under-represented communities to have their voice heard.

We want to address structural inequality and are particularly keen to receive applications from people who are underrepresented in the arts sector, and from those who experience discrimination due to race, gender identity, sexual orientation, marital status, race, religion, nationality, ethnic origin, disability or age.

Essential skills as a Trustee

- A genuine passion for arts, culture and communities.
- A strong understanding of the importance of inclusivity and equitable practice.
- Committed to working collaboratively with fellow trustees, the staff team, and community partners.
- Keen to foster positive, respectful relationships that reflect Papertrail's ethos of shared learning and support.
- Passionate about Wales and its cultures and supportive of the Welsh language.
- Ability to respectfully discuss and scrutinise official documents and processes.

Some skills you might already have:

- Experience of working with a range of funders and partners.
- Understanding of the charitable, arts or public sectors, particularly small arts organisations.
- Lived experience that resonates with the work of Papertrail and the projects it has created to date.

TRUSTEE ROLE

Your commitment as a Trustee

- We hold on average four board meetings a year, some in person and some online. Sometimes we might expect you to attend additional meetings to offer your counsel or expertise on certain areas of the business.
- Trustees need to allocate time to read Board papers and emails, as well as attend an annual strategy day with the staff team.
- As a Trustee with Papertrail you will have responsibility for ensuring that we fulfil our organisations charitable objectives and continue to serve audiences and communities throughout Wales and beyond.
- We ask that Trustees commit to serving on the board for a minimum of three years.
- Trustees are volunteers and unpaid for their duties on behalf of Papertrail. However travel expenses for attendance at away days and attendance at board meetings will be met.

To be a trustee, you must be:

- Aged 18 or over
- Based in the UK
- Must not be disqualified from acting as a trustee unless granted a waiver by the Charity Commission.
- Able to commit to a minimum of three years on the board and have time for meetings and scrutinising documents. Commit to attending the performances and events that Papertrail creates.

We are in the process of becoming a Charity and we expect our trustees to commit to the Charity Commission's six essential duties. More information about the Charity Commission's Trustee's duties can be found here.

She has previously campaigned for greater racial diversity on stage and screen, but more recently has been doing work that advocates for using the arts to help expand discussions in civil society (in contexts where this is restricted) and for promoting the engagement of young people in the arts.
